Did you know that 9 out of 10 people can be cured if colon cancer is caught early?

If you have no symptoms and are at average risk of getting colon cancer, you should be checked using the new fecal immunochemical test (FIT). A person is at average risk for colon cancer if they are 50 to 74 years old with no first-degree relative (parent, brother, sister or child) who has been diagnosed with the disease.
