(Nasal Spray)

Overdose Prevention



Naloxone is a medication that blocks the effects of opioid overdose.

Naloxone kits are given to anyone who uses opioid drugs; or to family and friends who want to prevent the overdose of a loved one.

You will receive education about how to prevent drug overdose, the signs of an overdose, what to do when you see someone overdosing.

You will also receive training in administering Naloxone Nasal Spray.
